Step 2: Earn a master’s degree

Step 3: Gain Experience

Step 4: Find a Job”

“Archaeologist qualifications outside of education and experience generally include great critical-thinking and communication skills. Some positions may also prefer candidates who demonstrate some leadership abilities, have a strong work ethic, and are detail oriented. Depending on the position, archaeologists may also need some physical stamina to reach their research sites with all the necessary equipment.”

“Step 5: Career Advancement

As mentioned, some positions may prefer candidates with leadership experience, which may encourage students to go on and earn their Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Archaeology. Earning a PhD in the field also provides students with advance

knowledge and may enable them to travel and work internationally through foreign governments with more ease.”

“A PhD in Archaeology typically requires students to complete a dissertation, demonstrate reading proficiency in 2 foreign languages, and fulfill teaching responsibilities. These degree programs usually take more than 4 years to complete.”

dream big and work towards their goal. Every dream is achievable.










